(D.P.R. 249/98; D.P.R. 235/07)

The school is a learning environment in which pupils are formed. Were fundamental rules of civil coexistence and responsibility as well as collaboration with others are put in practice and reinforced daily.

The Educational Pact of Co-Responsibility has the explicit objective of defining the rights and duties between the school, the families, and pupils. - To offer students, through its teaching staff and operators, an open dialogue, tolerance and respect towards others and models of correct behaviour to follow.
- To ensure that life within the school premises is based on the utmost respect for all the school staff involved, for all school equipment, furnishings and all school areas indoors and outdoors.
- To ensure the respect of current regulations and privacy.
- To ensure a timely assessment of a student, its strengths and weaknesses to best help him/her on his/her academic progress.
- To enable custom or individualized learning skills that help the pupil (if required) to best achieve a healthy academic progress.
- To provide precise information on academic and non-academic decisions and rules within the school.
- To promote and support staff training initiatives.

The **families** undertake:

- To establish a constructive dialogue with teachers, in respect of their teaching and assessing skills.
- To follow and enhance positively their child's academic and educational experience.
- To daily check the school diary and frequently check their child's notebooks, replace missing materials and make sure their uniform is in order.
- To make sure to check and carefully read notices and communications on time. To sign and give in time the necessary forms for school activities that require it.
- To limit out of school hour exits and entries, in respect of the preset timetable schedule, the pupils and the teachers.
- To participate and attend school meetings.
- To take notice that the school, during the school year and all events, is not liable or responsible for any damage, theft or loss of objects brought to school by the pupils.
- To compensate, collaborate and take responsibility for any damage to school property caused by your child during the school year and during school events.
- Not to publish on any social media or by any other means of publicity or communication: images or documents directly or indirectly regarding and explicitly referring to Piccola England School. Also, not to express comments or opinions of any kind that are related to or refer to Piccola England School.

INDICATIONS OF THE ATS (Agenzia di Tutela della Salute) REGARDING THE RULES AND ORGANIZATIONAL METHODS SPECIFIC TO THE EMERGENCY SITUATION

Dr. Paola Frölichsthal Schoeller is appointed COVID Referent of our school.

Following the up-to-date indications, which may be subject to further changes in the short or long term, here we present the organizational and managerial procedures that will be implemented during this school year.

We ask all families for the up most collaboration and respect for the procedures and indications provided. The key point of the rules is to encourage the mapping of possible infections, in order to intervene soon as possible and prevent, or limit the spread of the virus.

1.- It is forbidden for parents or other family members or nannies to enter beyond the school's entrance gate. Your child will enter the school premises by him/herself. The children will form a line keeping a security distance from each other at the entrance door and one of our school operators will verify and check the body temperature and that all is in order before admitting them inside the school.

2.- If the registered body temperature is above 37.5°C, your child will not be admitted to school, you will be immediately notified to come and collect your child and are kindly invited to consult your paediatrician to ascertain the symptoms.

3.- Parents of children attending school for the first time in 1st grade will be allowed to accompany their child inside the schoolyard only for the first week of school. Body temperature of both parent and child will be taken.

4.- If one or both parents or sibling/s has a fever or is unwell, it is not possible for your child to attend school, unless the attending physician or paediatrician has excluded Coronavirus and variants, communicating this through a certification that must be brought to school.

5.- The school staff is equipped with a mask; it is mandatory for children 6 years old and above to wear a surgical mask provided by the parents. In event the child does not have one, it will be provided by the school (the school still has masks available delivered by the Ministry).

6.- The school will contact immediately the parents, if during school hours their child presents fever (37.5 C or more) or other suggestive COVID symptoms. In such case, the parent or other appointed family member or other person appointed by the parents must collect the child from school and sign a document provided by the ATS: stating that the parent must declare that given the presence of suggestive COVID-19 symptoms, will verify the clinical situation together with the treating paediatrician. For the child to be re-admitted to school the parents must bring a certification stating the child's good health and

the absence of infectious or dangerous pathologies for the school community, signed by the treating paediatrician.

7.- Parents or appointed person will wait for their child, at the end of the school day, inside the schoolyard, avoiding gatherings and maintaining safety distances from each other.

8.- If a child presents suggestive symptoms to Covid virus and/or its variants at school, the procedure indicates that if not already wearing a surgical mask, then he/she must immediately put one on. The child, assisted by a qualified staff member, PPE or teacher, is to be isolated from the rest of the pupils and his/her parents have the civic duty and responsibility to collect their child as soon as they are notified by the school.

9.- Only a confirmed case will constitute reason to initiate, on behalf of the school, the necessary containment measures established by the region's sanitary authority.

10.- Please do not bring your child to school if he/she presents: severe or constant cough, cold, fever, conjunctivitis, gastrointestinal discomfort, as they will be prevented from entering the classroom. If such symptoms should occur during school hours, then you will be promptly notified, and precautionary isolation procedures will be implemented, such as stated in item 7.

11.- The classrooms and other common indoor areas will be cleaned and sanitized daily. School equipment will be sanitized as necessary during the school day.

12.- During the first weeks of school, the pupils will be assisted, reinforced, and taught the necessary preventive hygiene habits: if your child has intolerances or allergies to sanitizers please report or contact the school promptly. In any event we encourage hand washing as much as possible, using water and neutral soap.

13.- The conditions to attend school are as follow: absence of respiratory symptoms or body temperature above 37.5°C, up to at least three days prior the return to school. Not to have been in any sort of quarantine in the previous 14 days to your child's return to school, and not to have been in close contact with covid positive people (to your knowledge).

14.- The school's classrooms and common areas and equipment will be organized by a specific class and activity, that cannot be occupied or shared contemporary or subsequently by other classes or activities, unless the space and equipment have been adequately cleaned and sanitized.

15.- If the school's staff cannot guarantee the safety distance, then it will always wear the surgical mask or other protective equipment.

16.- The classrooms will be ventilated on each change of lesson and common areas will be frequently ventilated.

17.- Body temperature will be taken prior access to lunchroom. During the lunch period in the refectory, children will be required to maintain an adequate behaviour that favours physical distancing. The disposition of tables by class and place assignment are set in such a way to guarantee the necessary distance in static condition.

18.- The school is equipped with signs in common areas that limit gatherings and marked paths in corridors and recreational areas that guarantee safety

distances. The mid-morning break will be carried out in the courtyard or garden preferably or inside the classroom when it's not possible to access the external areas. In indoor areas, the use of a mask, always is necessary.

19.- Outdoor education in nature and out of school activities will be prioritized (compatibly with weather conditions) as an alternative way of learning.
